ASH WEDNESDAY: A service of Holy Communion with Ashing will take place at 10.30am on Wednesday February 14th in the church. If you are able, do join us for this service that marks the official beginning of Lent. If you are unable to attend, there will be 'ashes on the go' at the bottom of Highbury Fields between 8am and 9am, as a joint initiative between Christ Church and our neighbours, Hope Church Islington.

LENT GROUPS: This year our Lent course is 'The Mystery of Everything' - a series of Bible readings and discussions based upon the themes raised in the film 'The Theory of Everything'. Our Sunday sermons will also be following the same themes over the first five Sundays in Lent. Our Home Groups will be following this material and have spaces available for people to join - you can sign up via sheets on the noticeboard in the Fellowship Room. Joining a Lent Group is a great way of going deeper with God during the Lent season, as well as building relationships within the congregation.

QUIET DAY IN LENT: Would you like a mini-retreat in London? DONATION FOR CHURCH FOOD SUPPLIES: As the winter sets in we have more callers than ever. We are in desperate need of tinned and dried goods to keep the shelves stocked. It would be very much appreciated if could add an extra item or two to your regular shopping list and bring something along to the church whenever you can or you can drop it into the office during office hours. The sorts of things that we are in most need of are: pasta, rice, pasta sauce, tinned meat, tinned veg, sugar, tins of tomatoes, milk (dried or UHT), soup, fruit, custard, instant coffee and tea bags.

PARISH REDEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE: A short update of work over the last few months on the proposed new Church Centre. Our architects, Matthew Lloyd Architects, have submitted revised plans based on Islington Council's helpful feedback. We now enter a new consultation phase until 14 December. ISLINGTON CENTRE FOR REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS – Is an independent charity, open 3 days a week. Our students, in most cases, have no income or financial support and in the case of asylum seekers cannot work to support themselves. In addition to the teaching of English, advice, support and practical help is given to students. Tea, coffee, lunch are provided and food supplies distributed. Non-perishable food such as instant coffee, tea bags, milk (UHT), sugar, rice, pasta, sauces, tinned meat and vegetables, cereals, tins of tuna, tomatoes, beans, cooking oil (no out-of-date products please) and toiletries can be brought in to Christ Church on Sundays clearly marked for the Centre and either left on the table to the right of the kitchen hatch, or handed to me.
